WHAT'S NEW FOR 2015?

Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA):

Based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index from the third quarter of 2013 through the third quarter of 2014, Supplemental Security Income (SSI) beneficiaries will receive a **1.7 percent COLA** for 2015.

Other important updates:

- The Substantial Gainful Activity (SGA) amount for individuals with disabilities other than blindness has increased from \$1070/month to \$1090.
- The **SGA** amount for individuals who are blind has increased from \$1800/month to **\$1820**.
- The monthly earnings amount used to determine if a month counts for a **Trial Work Period (TWP)** has increased from \$770 to **\$780**.
- The income amount that will have no effect on benefits for SSI beneficiaries who are **students (Student Earned Income Exclusion)** has increased from \$1750/month to **\$1780**. The **yearly maximum** amount has increased from \$7060 to **\$7180**.
- The **1619b Massachusetts State Threshold Amount** for individuals receiving SSI is **\$40,006** (**\$40,855** for people who are blind). This means that even if SSI cash benefits are eliminated, MassHealth coverage will remain in effect until annual earnings reach this threshold amount.
